Temptation

The devil tempts us, when we are at our weakest point but he will also appeal to our vanity and encourage us to use our best attributes in a subtly bad way. Have you ever noticed that when you are tired or hungry you can make impulsive decisions that are not good for you. Sometimes you get away with it and this entices you to try it again but taking a greater risk this time and so on and so on.

Another way the Devil tempts you is to entice you to use your most cherished gift in a subtle and not so subtle bad way. For example, God gave you a superior ability to able to use social media technology. This means you get do things on your laptap, ipad, tablet easier and faster than your friends. This is a great gift as long as you use for the best. But if you begin to exploit your ability to belittle others then you are giving into the bad thoughts that the Devil sends you in subtly and sometimes amusing ways.

So how do you resist temptations? Realise that God is very near you. God's Holy Spirit dwells within you. He is in your mind all the time. Every good thought that comes to you every day comes from God. Every bad thought comes from the Devil. If you let the good thoughts replace the bad thoughts more and more then you will be better able to resist temptation. One way of assisting this is to thank God, when something good happens with a word or phrase and tell the Devil to get behind you when he is trying to tempt you. Most people say these words or phrases silently.

It is important to always remind yourself that 'The word, that is the faith we proclaim, is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart,' as St Paul stated in the second reading. To say this more simply, God is very near you.
